#### FM PARTIAL "FREEZE" NOT APPLICABLE TO ~~KENNETH~~ RESERVED CHANNELS

Pending resolution of the allocation questions at issue in the over-all FM allocation proceeding (Docket 14185), the FCC, on Dec. 17, adopted a partial "freeze" on the consideration and further acceptance of applications for new FM stations or changes in the channels of existing stations. It is anticipated that the "freeze" will last no longer than six months.

However, the FCC specifically exempted reserved educational channels from this "freeze," although the FCC Public Notice (#29130) of this action does not so indicate. As indicated in earlier Washington Reports, it is possible that the reserved channels may be affected by any new FM allocation plan, although the NAEB will strive to prevent any inroads. Therefore, it would be wise for those with tentative plans for FM stations to finalize their plans as soon as possible and get applications in to the FCC for new FM stations.

#### COX NAMED TO FCC

President Kennedy has announced his intention of naming Kenneth Cox (currently Chief of the FCC Broadcast Bureau) to the FCC when T.A.M. Craven retires Jan. 31. Although the President announced that Cox would fill Craven's unexpired term (which ends June 30), it is anticipated that Cox will then be named to a full seven-year term. Cox, 46, had first contact with radio-tv as special counsel for Sen. Magnuson's Commerce Com. hearings (on networks, etc.) in 1956; has been with FCC since April, 1961.

#### ~~Proposals~~ PROPOSALS FOR ETV CHANNEL SHIFTS

By Notices of Proposed Rule Making, the FCC invited comments (dec. 17) to the following proposals affecting ETV reservations:

1. By Bd. of Ed. of Ogden City, Utah, permittee of station KVOG-TV on commercial Ch. 9 in Ogden City, to shift reservation from Ch. \*24 to Ch. 9 in that city; and
2. By Bd. of Regents, Eastern N. M. Univ. at Portales, N. M., in cooperation with the State Dept. of Ed., to shift ETV Ch. \*3 from Roswell to Portales.
