MINUTES.

The Pea River Baptist Association met with New Providence Church, Coffee County, Alabama, in its Seventh Annual Session, on the 1st. day of November A. D., 1883. The Introductory Sermon was preached by Elder I. Spence, at 11 o'clock, A. M. After one hour and a half for refreshments the body was called to order by the Moderator, Elder Jesse M. Rowe. Prayer by Elder J. G. McCaskey.

By request brothers B. M. Stevens and J. G. McCaskey, read the letters from the several churches.

Delegates names were enrolled as follows:

New Ebenezer—J. A. Taylor, Wm. Taylor and N. B. Fleming.

Mount Lebanon—J. A. McGee, R. E. Wise and W. G. W. Harper.

Then proceeded to an election of officers, which resulted in the re-election of Elder Jesse M. Rowe, Moderator, A. J. Wise Jr., Clerk, and C. R. Talbot, Treasurer.

Then invited visiting ministers to seats in the body. Called for petitionary letters from churches desiring to unite with the Association, when a letter was presented from the Elba Baptist Church by her delegates, B. M. Stevens, S. B. Harper and A. R. Chapman. Also one from

New Hope Church by her delegates, Willie J. Horn, Samuel Wood and W. H. H. Johnson, both of which together with their delegates were received and the right hand of fellowship extended by the Moderator in behalf of the Association.

Called for Correspondence, when J. D. Parkman, G. W. L. Parkman and E. M. Brooks responded from Salem Association, and W. W. Fleming and N. C. Underwood from Newton Association, and W. H. Archer, from the Zion Association. Then the committee on divine service reported as follows: At 3 o'clock p. m. at the stand Elder M. Brooks; at 7 o'clock p. m., Elder John Bradley, at Elba; 7 o'clock p. m., Elder J. G. McCaskey; at the stand 11 o'clock a. m. to-morrow, N. C. Underwood. On motion adjourned until 9 o'clock a. m. to-morrow.

FRIDAY MORNING, Nov. 2nd, A. D., 1883.

The Association met pursuant to adjournment. Singing and prayer by W. C. T. Moseley.

Renewed the invitation to visiting ministers, when Elder I. Spence responded from Bethlehem Association, and W. C. T. Moseley from the Alabama Association. On motion the regular order of business was suspended, when brother B. M. Stevens offered the following resolution:

Resolved, That this Association co-operate with the State Convention upon all subjects of missionary work, both State, Home, and Foreign. After being elaborately discussed, was adopted.

On motion a committee consisting of B. M. Stevens, S. B. Harper and Robert Harper was appointed to devise, or plan a system by which to raise a fund to co-operate with the State Convention, and to report at an early day to the Executive Committee for approval.

The following resolution was offered by A. J. Wise Jr.:

Resolved, That we are due, and hereby tender our thanks to the kind citizens in the surrounding vicinity, for the kindness shown us during our stay among them.

The committee appointed last session to see brother A. Windham, reported and satisfaction was given.

On motion the Minute fund was turned over to the Clerk to furnish the Churches with Minutes.

The Association then adjourned, to meet with Bethlehem Church, Coffee County, Thursday before the first Sabbath in November 1884.

Rules of Decorum.

RULE 1. The Moderator shall fill the Chair and preserve order in the Association, which shall be opened and closed with prayer.

RULE 2. The privileges and authority of the Moderator shall be respected by all the members; he shall decide all questions of order and propriety.

RULE 3. The Moderator shall vote in no case, unless there is a tie in the Association, then he shall give the casting vote. He shall have

the same privilege of speaking as other members, provided, he shall appoint some member to fill the chair.

RULE 4. But one member shall speak at a time, who shall rise from his seat and address the Moderator, and keep to the subject; and he shall not speak more than twice on the same subject without leave from the Chair.

RULE 5. No member shall leave the body while on business, except by permission from the Chair.

RULE 6. When a question is taken up, after allowing time for deliberation, the Moderator shall take the voice of the body by calling for the yeas and nays.

RULE 7. All motions in order must be disposed of by the body, unless withdrawn by him that made it.

RULE 8. A list of the names of the delegates shall be called and absentees marked.

RULE 9. The Clerk shall enroll the names of the delegates, and keep a regular record of all the business of the Association.

RULE 10. The Minutes of the Association shall be read and corrected before the body rise.

RULE 11. This Decorum may be altered, or amended, by two-thirds of this body.
